



**Are you interested in working your Senior year and earning credit for working? Then Co-Op or CTE Internship may be for you!**

## Co-Op Internship

Level of Difficulty: All Levels                      Time: Full year course                      Credits: 3  
Prerequisites: Students must have completed a Level III CTE course. Course is open to Seniors. Teacher interview required.

This course is designed to give the student classroom instruction in necessary life skills (computer skills, financial planning, taxes, human relations, etc.) as well as on-the-job experience in the student's chosen career field. The student will attend a Co-Op class and also work an average of 15 hours per week on the job. Students will learn job skills, earn school credit (3 credits) and get paid.

### Frequently asked questions about Co-Op Internship

**What must students do to be admitted into a Co-Op Internship?** Students fill out an interest form stating which program holds their interest and their present career goals. Students will then be called in for an interview with a coordinator who will determine if they are qualified for the program.

**Do students earn three credits for one year in Co-Op?** Yes. One credit is given for the class and two credits are earned for on-the-job training.

**Do all Co-Op students get jobs?** The Co-Op program provides assistance in obtaining a job, but does not guarantee employment.

## CTE Internship

Level of Difficulty: All Levels                      Time: Full year course                      Credits: 1  
Prerequisites: Students must be classified as a Senior and at least 16 years of age. Students must have completed at least one level III course in a CTE program. Teacher interview required.

The CTE Internship provides CTE students an opportunity to engage in learning through participation in a structured work experience that involves the application of previously developed CTE knowledge and skills. The CTE Internship must be directly related to the CTE program where the credits were earned and offers both paid and unpaid work experience.

### Frequently asked questions about CTE Internship

#### What are the distinguishing differences between CTE Internship and Co-Op Internship?

It's possible there may be no classroom time required for CTE Internship courses. Co-Op includes classroom learning and supervised work-based learning. Students in Internship earn one (1) additional credit.

CTE Internship is an opportunity for students who are already employed in an area that correlates to their program of study to earn additional credit (1) for their work experience.

#### What must students do to be admitted into CTE Internship?

Students fill out an interest form stating which program they qualify for. Students must receive signature of qualifying teacher. Students will then be called in for an interview with a coordinator who will determine if they are qualified for the program.
